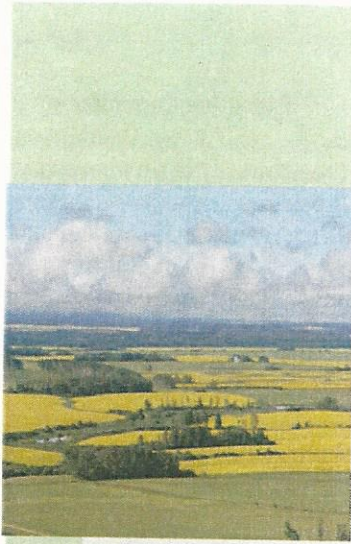

JULY 26 by 5:00 P.M. ARTICLES ARE TO BE
BROUGHT IN ON JULY 28 by 11:30 A.M.**

EXHIBITOR'S FEES: *In the home living section an EXHIBITOR'S FEE IS NOT required to enter. Adult exhibitors have the following options:*

**Exhibitors paying \$20.00 in entry fees can purchase an exhibitor's bracelet (three-day pass) for \$24.00*

** Exhibitors paying \$15.00 in entry fees can purchase an exhibitor bracelet (three-day pass) for \$32.00*

** Exhibitors paying \$10.00 in entry fees can purchase an exhibitor bracelet (three-day pass) for \$38.00.*

** Or paying \$16.00 per day gate admission.*

This bracelet admits you to activities on the grounds and to Friday, Saturday, and Sunday grandstand performances. This bracelet does not include Thursday night grandstand, Friday and Saturday Night dances and midway rides.

1. Adult entry fees are \$1.00 per entry. For children 12 years and under, fees are \$0.50 per entry. Children, if entering in adult classes children will pay the entry fee of \$1.00 per entry. No exhibitor fee is required.
2. All entries must be made on the printed form inside the prize list. These forms are to be completed and signed by the exhibitor. These forms are to be dropped off, emailed, or mailed to **Box 116 Swan River, MB. R0L1Z0**. If entering after Sunday prior to the Exhibition, the Secretary will be at the office on the fairgrounds. Entry forms must be received by 5:00 P.M. Tuesday prior to the fair.
3. All exhibits must be the work and property of the exhibitor only. Grasses and Horticulture must be the property of the exhibitor.
4. Only one entry can be made in each exhibit.
5. No article will be allowed to compete in more than one class.
6. **N.B.** Exhibits must be brought to the building. **TAGS ATTACHED AND READY TO EXHIBIT** between 9:00 A.M. and 11:30 A.M. on Thursday prior to the fair. Judging starts at 1:00 P.M. in the Home Craft Building. Exhibits must remain in place until 8:00 P.M. Sunday, the last day of the exhibition. The **Home Craft Building and the Horticulture/Photography/Junior Art Building** will be closed between 7:00 and 8:00 P.M. to

allow directors to assemble exhibits. Exhibitors must remove articles from the hall between 8:00 and 9:00 P.M. on Sunday.

7. Exhibits in the Horticulture Building can be removed between 8:00 P.M. and 9:00 P.M. on Sunday.
8. In case of a tie in total points awards, the exhibitor with the most first prizes will be the winner.
9. In the absence of competition in any section, or if the article exhibited is of inferior quality, the judges will award only such prizes as they think deserving. **THE JUDGE'S DECISION IS FINAL.**
10. A meeting of the directors will be held to hear and decide complaints or grievances that may arise in awarding prizes. Protests may be made in writing on day of show.
11. **PRIZE MONEY WILL BE PAID BY CHEQUE BY MAIL.**
12. The directors will take every precaution possible under the circumstances to ensure the safety of the articles brought to the exhibition. Should an article by accident be damaged, lost or stolen, they will give all assistance in their power towards the recovery of the same, but will not make payment of the value thereof.

Class #1 GRASSES

NOTE: Sheaves must be average of 10 inches in circumference. TIED AT THE CENTRE OF THE SHEAF. Full length of straw to be shown in all cases without roots. Sheaf to be tied in three places. All varieties must be named. Leaves should be stripped from the grain sheaves.

Class #3 CUT FLOWERS AND PLANTS

NOTE: For the purpose of judging, a bouquet will be the number of flowers and foliage or grasses that may be held in one hand. No Lady Slippers or Wild Orchids accepted. Preference will be given to varieties that are named.

Suggestions for preferred display:

- No buds showing color should be on any annual exhibit. Please remove them.
- Use a bed of foliage to showcase roses in rose bowls, keeping the bloom from becoming waterlogged.
- Houseplants – use leaf shine or whatever sparingly on ivies, etc. One of the goals of presentation is to keep the exhibit looking natural.
- Potted plants – pay attention to the scale of plant to container. General rule – the plant should be 1 ½ times taller and wider than the container. Deadhead spent blooms and remove dead leaves.
- Please remove greenhouse tags.

2019 Manitoba Ag Society Provincial Quilt Competition Rules and Regulations (Subject to changes)
Non-adherence to these Rules can result in disqualification

1. Competition is open to all quilt exhibitors.
2. The judging criteria are included in the "Judging Standards" Fair Book.
3. Quilts may be entered in four categories: Ø hand quilted Ø domestic/mid arm – fabric is manipulated by hand under a fixed machine Ø track (mid/long arm) – this includes where the machine rides on wheels and moves over the fabric and the machine is hand guided. No computer programmed quilting will be allowed. Ø computerized quilting – where the quilting design has been computer programmed
4. The quilt must be completely done by the person submitting the quilt.
5. No commercial quilting will be allowed (machine quilted by someone other than the exhibitor).
6. Quilts must have an appropriate title and give appropriate credit to pattern designer if not original.
7. Quilts must be clean; any with stains and/or markings; pet hair will not be accepted
8. Quilts must have a perimeter of at least 240 inches (590 cm) to be considered for the competition.
9. Fabric quilt label must be attached to the bottom right corner on the backside of the quilt entry. • Labels must be covered at all judging levels.
10. Quilts must be delivered/packaged in a durable and labeled clear plastic bag for handling.
11. Quilters must sign a release form when the quilt is entered at the local event.
12. A Judges Score Sheet will be distributed to all Societies, which must be used to judge the quilts. Any quilt not scoring 70 or more points will not qualify for the District or Provincial Competition.
13. Each Society may select up to eight quilts (2 hand quilted, 2 domestic, 2 track and 2 computerized) at their Fair to participate in the District Competition. Up to a total of eight quilts will be chosen at the District Competition to go on to the Provincial Competition.
14. Exhibitors may enter more than one quilt in this competition. However, they may only have one in each category advance to the Provincial Competition.
15. Any quilt may be entered in competition at as many Fairs as the exhibitor wishes. However, it may only represent the Society where it was first entered in the Provincial Competition and won. The exhibitor must advise Societies at the time of entry if their quilt is a winner at a previous fair.
16. If an exhibitor does not wish to participate in the Provincial Competition, the runner-up quilt with a score higher than 70 will be selected to represent the society in the District Competition.
17. At the district level prize monies will be awarded for the top quilts in each category. At the provincial finals, there will be prize monies available in the Hand Quilted, Domestic, Track, and Computerized Quilting Categories.
18. All District Winners/Provincial Entries will be held for display at the Provincial Quilt Finals; and are encouraged to be available for the 2020 Red River Ex. Quilters are responsible to deliver/pick up their quilt(s).
19. MAAS will take the utmost care of the quilts; however, quilt owners are responsible for ensuring their own quilts, if they so choose. The sponsors, societies, and M.A.A.S. will not be liable for damage or loss.

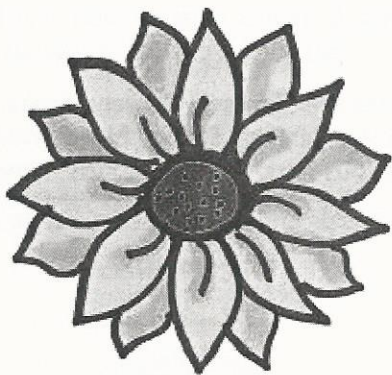
